We have a close relationship with the Mintridge Foundation, in fact their founder Alex Wallace was a student with us and has very fond memories of her time at our school. So, it is always a treat to be able to invite their ambassadors into school. This week, Ben Gallagher, who is an Invictus Games medallist and in training for this year's Paralympic Games in Paris, deliverered an inspirational assembly. Ben has achieved remarkable things despite some tremendous adversity in his life. Ben will be working with several of our older pupils as a mentor over the coming months: offering advice and guidance as they move onto the next stages of their educational journey.





As you will be aware, we are always looking for ways to promote reading in our school, so it was lovely to be able to invite one of the more mature members of our school community into our school this week. Anne astounded us with her energy and enthusiasm, and I know that the children from Elms class loved spending time with a beautiful book and getting lost in Anne's story telling skills. They even got to cuddle some of the characters from the book!



The hard work on developing reading start straight away at Cranford and we are rightly proud of our phonics provision. The team do an amazing job and the result is that the children in Acorns and Elms have a brilliant start to their 'reading journey'. It was lovely to receive a letter from Minister for Schools, Damian Hinds congratulating us on our brilliant Phonic Screen Check Scores which place us in the top 1% of all primary schools. More importantly, all the hard work means that our children develop the key skills to ensure that they have every opportunity to flourish and prosper in the future!!

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I am writing to congratulate you on your school's outstanding achievement in the 2023 Phonics Screening Check.

We want to ensure every child develops a firm grasp of phonics as the basis on which to improve standards of reading. As such I was delighted to see your results.

With 100 per cent of pupils in Year 1 at Cranford CofE Primary School meeting the expected standard in the check, your school is in the top 1 per cent of all primary schools in the country.

The latest figures show that 83 per cent of pupils who met the expected standard in the check went on to achieve at least the expected standard in reading at key stage 2 in 2023, which underlines the importance of developing the ability to decode words effectively at an early age.

Your particular success in teaching phonics and early reading so effectively means your pupils are developing a firm foundation, from which they can become increasingly fluent and develop a lifelong love of reading.

I would like to thank you for your commitment and success in this vital area of a child's early education and congratulate you, your staff and pupils again on all you have achieved.
